World War Two Evacuation Experience

Class Six ended their World War Two topic on a high just before half term, when they time travelled back to 1940 and were 'evacuated' to the countryside. They travelled by steam train from Winchcombe to Broadway and then back again. Along the way they had a sing-along of wartime songs and there was a mysterious German 'spy' on the train, who was apprehended at the station. They then went to meet their new 'teacher', who told them more about the jobs they may have to do with their new family and they were shown many interesting artefacts. There was also an air raid which meant they had to take cover in an ARP shelter and sit in almost darkness listening to the 'bombs' outside. They found it very scary! Once the all-clear sounded, they had to gather hoses and water and then take it in turns to use a stirrup pump to activate the hoses. They were all very good at that! Well done Class Six!

Class 4 Making Use Of The Leaves!

The collected leaves will be stored in the black bag, with some holes and kept moist. The leaves will naturally break down over 12-18 months to reveal a dark-brown, light compost/mulch, which we can then use in our school garden.








Black History Month.

October was Black History Month and through the school we spent time learning about significant people and events. We have designed our curriculum so that children learn about a different aspect of this as they progress through the school.

In year six they have been learning about WW2 and as part of that they have been learning about how the HMT Empire Windrush ship transported Caribbean people to Britain. These people came to help rebuild the country from the damage of the war. They looked at the discrimination they sadly faced when they arrived and the contribution they made to make our country more diverse.

Parent/Teacher Consultations

Thank you to all of you who attended the meetings. It is an ideal opportunity for both teachers and you to share successes, concerns and targets regarding your child's progress. We want to remove any barriers which may prevent individual children from reaching their full potential – an effective dialogue with parents and support at home are always vital.

Attendance

School attendance continues to be good. As we enter the winter months, we will see an increase in the normal winter illnesses causing children to be off school. This is unavoidable. However, this is a reminder that holidays must not be booked during term time. It is often a cause of upset to parents when they see 'unauthorised absence' on their child's record so please remember that term time leave can only be authorised in 'exceptional circumstances'. The government defines persistent absence as that of 90% and below which is the equivalent of a day absent per fortnight. Our school attendance target is 95%+. We will continue to send you your child's attendance record every term.

Winters on its way – be prepared!

As weather more typical of the season takes hold, please remember to always send your child to school with a coat and, if necessary, a pair of wellies, hat, gloves and a scarf so that they are comfortable at morning and lunchtime plays. This will also help with those more unplanned moments of the school day such as an autumn walk or exploring the first frosts of the season. I would also recommend packing a spare pair of socks in case they get wet during break or lunch.

This newsletter is always a good opportunity to remind you of our procedures for closure due to adverse weather conditions, which are overleaf.

Adverse Weather Conditions

On rare occasions in winter, conditions may be hazardous with snow and ice. A decision will be made by the Senior Leadership Team, based on local conditions and whether it is safe to open the school. This will take into account conditions within school grounds **and** the local area. Consideration also must be given to the safety of staff travelling from further distances.

If in doubt:

- Check your phone for a text from us
- Consult the council website https://closures.gloucestershire.gov.uk/
- Listen to local radio bulletins
- Consider possibilities for child care

As a <u>very</u> last resort, ring school, but please delay your call until after 8am.

We will open as long as it is safe to do so **and** we are confident that sufficient staff will be in school. We appreciate a sudden school closure is extremely disruptive for working parents. However, always make sure that you have a contingency plan for child care should a class or the school close.

<u>If we are not opening</u> this will be posted on the school and council website, a text will be sent to the priority mobile that we have for you and the closure will be stated on local radio bulletins.

If the weather deteriorates during the day

- School will be kept open until the last child has left the premises.
- Only in extreme circumstances would school close and a pupil would never be sent home without a parent/carer.
- If the weather is severe parents may contact the school if they feel that they would like to collect their child early for safety reasons (i.e. travelling/walking long distances or collecting children from other closed schools). Children will not be let out during the final 15 minutes of the day.


