SATS

We are now in a position to share our provisional KS2 performance data for 2024. The Y6 children sat reading and maths tests in May. They also took a test in grammar, punctuation and spelling. Writing was completed through teacher assessment of their class work. We are delighted with how well the children performed, exceeding national data in most areas. Well done to the children, and all of the staff that supported them through their time at Hempsted. The results were:

Communication

If you're new to the school, and even if you aren't, please remember to read each newsletter carefully. Black History

October is Black History month. During the week beginning the 14th October each class will have sessions where they explore and celebrate significant black individuals whose actions and achievements have changed the world we live in.

Helping your Child at Home

The most important thing you can help with at home (other than teaching your children to keep safe, be healthy, and have good manners!!) is READING. Therefore, reading will always be at the heart of homework in each year group. In the earlier years, this may be help with their phonics (sounds) and learning simple words, to developing comprehension skills in the older years. Learning to read opens the door to so many other things, and this is why we are prioritising it over everything else. Your child's teacher will let you know the expectations for them in terms of how often they should be reading with an adult at home. We must also point out that it is hugely beneficial for a child to be read to as well – this will help them with their comprehension and their own storytelling skills.


With the exception of Reception, your child should have a copy of the term's spellings that need to be learnt.

Teachers will also be setting occasional online maths activities using APPS like numbots and TTRockstars.

Sports



Last week the Girls' Football Team had an away game against Grange School. They had a great start to their season with a 2-0 win. This Wednesday they qualified from a 'round robin' of games at Kingsway School and have the finals in two weeks time. Good luck girls.

The Boys' Football Team have also started the new school year with two round-robin tournaments under their belts and are keen to get the season started.

Lunch Boxes

It is always really good to see healthy snacks and balanced lunches. The children are very knowledgeable about the importance of '5 a day', a varied/balanced diet from the different food groups and not too much sugar or fat.

We have a few rules about what should be provided. Please note:

- 1. We expect that children will be given food that they normally eat.
- 2. We do not allow sweets, fizzy drinks or chocolate bars.
- 3. Children must ask to leave the table and we expect all/most food to be eaten.

***Just to remind you that <u>nuts (including foods containing nuts) are not allowed</u> in school because we have children who suffer from allergies. ***

All Key Stage One (Reception, Class One and Class Two) children have a piece of fruit provided for their snack through the government's 'Free Fruit and Veg Scheme'.

All Key Stage Two children need to bring their own fruit for snack time.

Riotous Royalty

Class 4 are learning about different monarchs who have had an impact on British History. So far we have studied William the Conqueror and King John. We enjoyed making our own Magna Carta (The Great Charter) that is still part of our English Law today. We had an area of the classroom set up as Runnymede (area near London) to sign and seal each handmade Magna Carta, just like King John did on 12th June 1215.

Learning about Henry VIII was a hit, especially singing the Horrible Histories Rap about Henry and his 6 wives. Next is Queen Anne, Queen Victoria and of course our longest reigning monarch, Queen Elizabeth II.



Mini Police

Class 5 have joined the Mini Police project. This is a new project for Hempsted which will teach the children about the role of the Police and how to keep themselves and others safe. They will also be looking at issues such as parking, anti-social behaviour, crime prevention and celebrating diversity.



Hair and Jewellery in PE

One pair of <u>plain</u> stud earrings is allowed. Earrings should also be removed for PE. If your child is unable to remove their earrings, then you must send them to school with a roll of micropore tape. Also, if your child has hair that obstructs their view when they look down, then this must be tied back. Please send in a hair bobble.
